Gangubai: Portrayed by Ms. Anna Susan Roy (Natural Science Optional)


Neerja: Portrayed by Ms. Cizeya Antony (English Optional)

### **Debate Competition**

**Topic: Economic Independence is the True Freedom for Women**

As part of the International Women's Day 2024 celebrations, a Debate Competition was organized by Women's Cell on the topic "Economic Independence is the True Freedom for Women" on 7<sup>th</sup> March, 2024 at college auditorium. The event aimed to foster critical thinking among students and emphasize the importance of women's economic empowerment in achieving gender equality.

#### **Objectives**

- To encourage students to express their views on women's empowerment.
- To highlight the role of economic independence in achieving true freedom for women.
- To develop skills of argumentation, public speaking, and logical reasoning.

A total of six students from various optional subjects participated in the competition. Participants were divided into two groups: For the Topic and Against the Topic.

Participants include 'For the topic' - Elizabeth Sheen Sandra (Malayalam Optional), Bineesha B Suresh (Hindi Optional), Aazia Mohsin (Mathematics Optional) and 'Against the topic' - Adithi S (English Optional) Aparna Vinod (Natural Science Optional, Mansa Merine Tom (Commerce Optional).

The programme began with a prayer song, invoking blessings. Following the prayer, the competition was inaugurated by Principal, Dr. Benny Varghese. In his address, Principal emphasized the importance of economic independence in shaping a woman's identity and role in society. thought, Confidence and presentation, Logical reasoning and counter arguments. After evaluation, the following winners were announced:


Best Speaker (For the Topic): Ms. Elizabeth Sheen Sandra (Malayalam Optional).

The presentations were engaging, filled with visuals and videos. They encouraged discussions on how women continue to shape the future of India, and how important it is to give them equal access to education, technology, and leadership roles.
